





San Diego Partners Win National Public Safety Award

MetLife Foundation Community-Police Partnership Award honors San Diego leaders for the first time

San Diego, Calif. (October 26, 2010) – STAR/PAL, the San Diego Police Department, and the County of San Diego Probation Department will be honored with a MetLife Foundation Community-Police Partnership Award at a ceremony this Thursday, October 28th at 3 p.m. at STAR/PAL's Center to Serve Youth (4110 54th Street, San Diego CA 92105). Mayor Jerry Sanders, Police Chief William Lansdowne, Chief Probation Officer Mack Jenkins and other San Diego dignitaries, along with STAR/PAL partners and supporters, will be present to celebrate STAR/PAL's contributions to gang prevention, youth safety and the well-being of the City Heights community. The award ceremony will be followed by a barbecue with STAR/PAL youth participants and an open house at the center.

The national award, sponsored by MetLife Foundation and administered by the Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC), recognizes partnerships between community organizations and police departments that have reduced crime and spurred positive development in low-income communities. STAR/PAL—which is a joint effort with the San Diego Police Department and the County of San Diego Probation Department—was selected for the honor from more than 700 applicants nationwide. At Thursday's celebration event, Brentt A. Hoover, agency sales director of MetLife and Joe Horiye, executive director of San Diego LISC, will present a \$15,000 award to the partners.

STAR/PAL's organizational infrastructure and programmatic focus exemplify police and community collaboration. By having built its facility in Colina Del Sol Park surrounded by five neighborhood schools in City Heights, STAR/PAL offers a sense of safety to hundreds of youth who walk to and from school. Through a wide array of on-site and off-site youth programs, STAR/PAL promotes crime prevention, community building and leadership development, all under the tutelage of police and probation officers.

As a former prosecutor with the City of San Diego working in the criminal justice system, I can attest to the critical nature of the work we do at STAR/PAL," said Chandani Flinn, executive director of STAR/PAL. —Teaching our kids about safety issues, civic engagement and the importance of getting involved in enrichment activities pays major dividends. Our organization is truly unique in its ability to bring law enforcement role models together with underserved youth in order to empower them to make positive choices for themselves which ultimately benefits the whole community."
