Assault Suspects Sought

Up to \$1,000 Reward Offered

San Diego County Crime Stoppers and detectives from SDPD Central Division are asking for assistance from the public in identifying two suspects who attacked a man at the downtown San Diego Amtrak Station.

On December 21 at about 5 p.m. SDPD dispatchers received a call regarding a man who was attacked with a skateboard by two male suspects. Central Division patrol officers located the victim, 45-year-old Cornell Pratt at the scene. Pratt told officers that he didn't need medical attention. A witness told the officers that Pratt was struck in the head with a skateboard and shoved onto the train tracks.

The attack was captured on video; the video can be picked up at SDPD Headquarters Broadway side front counter until 4:00pm today.

The victim said the suspects were two men – one was a white male in his 20s about 5'8" with a medium build and the other was a dark skinned male about 5'8" tall.

Detectives are asking anyone with information on this incident to call SDPD Central Division at (619) 744-9500 or the **Crime Stoppers anonymous tip line at (888) 580-8477**. Crime Stoppers is offering up to a \$1,000 reward to anyone with information that leads to an arrest in this case. Anonymous email and text messages can be sent in via www.sdcrimestoppers.com.
