Woody Guthrie's Words and Music to be Performed as Part of Library's "California Labor History" Exhibition

SAN DIEGO – In conjunction with the City of San Diego Public Library's "California Labor History" exhibition, performer and teacher David Fenimore will sing and speak the words of Woody Guthrie on March 12 at 1 p.m. The performance will take place in the third floor auditorium of the Central Library, 820 E St., in downtown San Diego. The event is free.

An English professor at the University of Nevada, Reno, Fenimore began performing last year as folk music legend Woody Guthrie. His presentation will include a monologue woven from Woody's own words and snippets of his songs.

The "California's Labor History" panel exhibition combines reproductions of artwork, historic photographs and text that explore 11 crucial events in the state's labor history. The exhibition is presented by the City of San Diego Public Library, California State Library and the California Exhibition Resources Alliance through April 11. The exhibit will be displayed in the Second Floor Corridor Gallery at the Central Library. Admission is free.
