Easy-to-use resource for children in kindergarten through fifth grade, covering the arts, literature, current events, history, and more.

NoveList K-8

Database for finding picture books, chapter books, and young adult novels to read or use in the classroom. Includes full-text book reviews and teacher resources.

Oxford Art Online

Illustrated full-text reference works about art, including Grove's *The Dictionary of Art*.

Books That Inspired Students' Artwork: <u>Alice's Adventures in Wonderland</u> (1992) by Lewis Carroll. J FIC/CARROLL [Ages 9–adult] Classic story of a little girl who falls down a rabbit hole and discovers a world of amusing characters, with the original illustrations by John Tenniel.

Fahrenheit 451 (2003) by Ray Bradbury. FIC/BRADBURY [Ages 13–adult] Novel set in the future in which "firemen" burn books forbidden by a totalitarian regime.

<u>*Frederick*</u> (1967) by Leo Lionni. E/LIONNI [Ages 4–8] Picture book about a young mouse who daydreams instead of helping his family gather food for the winter, but then cheers them with his stories after winter comes.

The Giver (1993) by Lois Lowry. J FIC/LOWRY [Ages 12–14]

Newbery Medal-winning novel about a boy chosen to be his community's "receiver of memories" who discovers that the society is not as perfect as it seems.

<u>The Grapes of Wrath</u> (2002) by John Steinbeck. FIC/STEINBECK [Ages 13–adult]

Novel about Oklahoma farmers who are forced from their homes during the Great Depression and seek work as migrant fruit pickers in California.

Hands: Growing Up to Be an Artist (2004) by Lois Ehlert. E/EHLERT [Ages 9–12] Illustrated story of a girl who is inspired to become an artist as she works with her parents while they build, sew,

and garden.

<u>Twentieth-Century American Art</u> (2001) edited by Jan Greenberg. J 811.608/HEART [Ages 10–14] Compilation of poems stimulated by 47 different paintings, sculptures, and photographs.

<u>*Owl Moon*</u> (1987) by Jane Yolen. E/YOLEN [Ages 2–8] Caldecott Medal-winning picture book about a girl and her father's walk in the woods looking for owls.

<u>*Rainbow Fish*</u> (1996) by Marcus Pfister. E/PFISTER [Ages 2–7]

Colorful picture book about a beautiful fish who learns the importance of sharing.
