## NEW PARKING POLICY ANNOUNCED FOR RECREATIONAL VEHICLES AT QUALCOMM STADIUM

### Change Affects Aztec Games, Holiday Bowl, Monster Jam and Other Stadium Events; Chargers Games Under Similar But Different Policy

SAN DIEGO – Qualcomm Stadium management has created two recreational vehicle (RV) only parking lots for all events other than Charger games at Qualcomm Stadium. Beginning Thursday, August 31, 2006, all guests bringing RVs to an event will be directed to Lots A3 or J3. Please see the attached map for more details.

“The intermingling of cars and RVs has led to serious operational challenges and countless complaints from our fans,” said Erik Stover, Qualcomm Stadium Manager. “RVs need wider spaces to park and larger turning lanes. Trying to wedge a large RV in the middle of hundreds of cars is a challenge for everyone involved. Our goal is to improve traffic flow in and out of the stadium and everyone’s overall enjoyment when they visit Qualcomm Stadium.”

RVs will still be able to enter the Qualcomm Stadium site via any of the existing toll plazas. Parking personnel will then direct the drivers to the RV lots. Once inside the RV lot, drivers will find dedicated spaces equivalent to four traditional parking spaces and traffic personnel to assist in navigating the access lanes.

“I believe this will improve everyone’s game day experience. I’ve been to other stadiums with dedicated RV lots and those areas always have the liveliest atmosphere and the best tailgate parties,” added Stover. “Also, the car drivers will find it easier to get a space and to leave the stadium once the event is over.”

Parking fees for San Diego State University Aztec football games are \$10 per car and \$20 per RV. Parking fees for other major stadium events such as the Holiday Bowl or Monster Jam are \$16 per car and \$46 per RV.
