San Diego Public Library Starts Off 2022 with a Winter Reading Challenge

PROGRAM OFFERS PRIZES FOR READING BOOKS AND COMPLETING ACTIVITIES IN JANUARY

SAN DIEGO – Make reading a resolution in the new year and join the City of San Diego Public Library's annual Winter Reading Challenge. The program begins Saturday, Jan. 1, and the theme "Read for a Better World" encourages readers to explore diversity, empathy and action through literature.

"The Winter Reading Challenge is a great opportunity for people of all ages to strengthen their literacy skills and branch out from their typical reading choices," said Library Director Misty Jones. "From physical books to e-books, audiobooks and magazines, the San Diego Public Library offers a multitude of ways to discover stories that offer different perspectives and experiences."

The Winter Reading Challenge runs from Jan. 1 to Jan. 31, 2022, and is open to readers of all ages. Participants can earn prizes by completing a combination of five books, five hours of reading or literacy-based activities. Upon completion, readers will be eligible for prizes including passes to the Japanese Friendship Garden San Diego and a reusable snack container or utensil set.
