# **Environmental Justice**

The fair treatment of people of all races, cultures, and incomes with respect to the development, adoption, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies.

## Environmental Justice (EJ) values and policies are included in the General Plan and have been woven through other planning initiatives.

CA Senate Bill 1000 (SB 1000) has specific requirements:

- Identifying disadvantaged communities
- Developing goals, policies, and programs that address the unique and compounded health risks in disadvantaged communities and prioritize improvements and programs that meet the needs of disadvantaged communities.









# **Environmental Justice Screening**

Figure 1: Screening Process for Identifying Disadvantaged Communities





Map the planning area census tracts that have a combined score of 75 percent or higher in CalEnviroScreen.

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Map the planning area census tracts at or below statewide median income.



3. Map the planning area at or below the Department of Housing and Community Development's state income limits.



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Incorporate communityspecific data and examine for additional pollution burden.

Communities in top 25% of CalEnviroScreen 4.0 tool are represented in EJ Communities.





## **Environmental Justice Screen**

Climate and Economic Justice Screening Tool (CEJST) 1.0

All census tracts identified by CEJST 1.0 tool are included in EJ Communities.





# **Environmental Justice Screen**

**Climate and Resilience Map** 

Identifies areas with lower tree canopy and where households spend a larger portion of income on home energy costs and experience a higher heat risk.





# **Environmental Justice Screen**

## Food Apartheid Map

Identifies areas where higher percentage suffering from diabetes and obesity intersects with higher percentages participating in Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).





Environmental Justice Communities (EJ Communities)

EJ Communities – areas of the City most impacted and negatively affected by environmental burdens and associated health risks.
