

**SB719 Quiz 4 (Supervisor Responsibility and Joint Agency & Inter-Jurisdictional Pursuit)**

1. Upon initiation of a pursuit, a supervisor shall proceed to a quiet area away from the pursuit, monitor the pursuit, trust in the ability of their officers and not become actively involved in it.
2. Supervisors do not need to respond to the location at the end of the pursuit. They can ensure compliance with post-pursuit reporting requirements after phone call or meet up with the pursuing officers.
3. Supervisor's must verify the speed of the pursuit, and make a determination as to whether it is safe to continue the pursuit given the same factors used to initiate the pursuit, and any other changing factors necessary to ensure public safety, officer safety, safety of the fleeing violator(s), and effective pursuit tactics.
4. It is incumbent upon \_\_\_\_\_ to verify that no more units than necessary are involved.
5. Supervisors should cancel any units operating Code-3 that have not been authorized.
6. Factors to be considered by the supervisor in deciding whether to add units (Mark all that apply)
7. Barricading a roadway is strictly prohibited unless approved by \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_.
8. Barricading a roadway must be considered a use of force likely to result in moderate injuries.
9. With the approval of a field supervisor, Field Lieutenant, or the Watch Commander a roadway may be barricaded by occupied vehicles or vehicles belonging to private citizens only if the vehicles have airbags.
10. The supervisor, must have the driver of the unit who initiated the pursuit, or assumed the pursuit from another agency, be responsible for filling out the top half of form CHP-187A.
11. The pursuing officer's immediate supervisor shall (Mark all that apply)
12. Any SDPD unit can conduct the collision investigation of record on all injury, and non-injury traffic collisions resulting from pursuits that occur within the City of San Diego.
13. Section 17004.7(b) (1) of the California Vehicle Code mandates annual vehicle and weapons maintenance training for all sworn employees.

14. Pursuant to CVC 17004.7(b) (2), Officers of a public agency must certify in writing that they have received, read and understood the Department's vehicle pursuit policies and are required annually to complete an "SB 719 Pursuit Policy Training Attestation" form.
15. The initiating agency should generally retain jurisdiction and responsibility for a pursuit in progress, in the event the pursuit enters another agency's jurisdiction.
16. San Diego Police Department (SDPD) units can join in an active pursuit initiated by another agency without an SDPD supervisor's approval, because their Police powers don't end at the City Limits.
17. The primary unit, field supervisor, Communications, or ABLE can be responsible for determining if assistance is needed from another agency and shall specify what is needed to accomplish the task.
