Item 1: Conference with Legal Counsel.

Anticipated Litigation. Initiation of litigation pursuant to Government Code section 54956.9(c) (1 potential matters.) The Ethics Commission may meet in closed session to consider initiating a formal investigation against a person or persons who are alleged to have violated local ethics laws. Should an investigation be authorized, the identity of the person or persons being investigated will be available upon request only if and after a Draft Administrative Complaint is issued. The nature and details of the allegations will be available upon request only if and after a Final Administrative Complaint is issued.

Item 2: Conference with Legal Counsel.

Anticipated Litigation. Initiation of litigation pursuant to Government Code section 54956.9(c). (2 potential matters.) The Ethics Commission may meet in closed session to consider the issuance of a Draft Administrative Complaint, Dismissal, or Settlement of the matter, against a person or persons who are alleged to have violated local ethics laws. Should the filing of a Draft Administrative Complaint be authorized, the identity of the Respondent or Respondents will be available after a Draft Administrative Complaint is issued and the matter is noticed for discussion as pending litigation. The nature and details of the allegations will be available upon request only if and after a Final Administrative Complaint is issued.
