PURPOSE OF THE COMMISSION ON POLICE PRACTICES (CPP): Acting Chair Doug Case explained that the purpose of the Commission on Police Practices (CPP) is to provide an independent investigation of officer-involved shootings, in-custody deaths, and an unbiased evaluation of all complaints against the police department and its personnel in a process that will be transparent and accountable to the community. The Commission will also evaluate the review of all SDPD policies,

practices, trainings, and protocols and represent the community in making recommendations for changes. The mission of the Commission is to hold law enforcement accountable to the community and to increase community trust in law enforcement, resulting in increased safety for both the community and law enforcement.

The CAST meeting focused primarily on a highly successful event that had the participation of 2000 community members. CEC Yasmeen Obeid plans to also attend more community organizational events in the future.

- EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT (Interim ED Sharmaine Moseley) XI.
 - Caseload Update & Status of Case Reports It was reported that as of today, the A. Commission on Police Practices started out with 151 total cases assigned to the Teams. 51 of those cases are Category II cases. The audits of these Category II cases were suspended by the Commission since March of last year due to the backlog of cases. The backlog of cases can be attributed to the pandemic shutdowns, transitioning to remote case review, decrease in number of appointed Commissioners due to resignations, and delay in appointing new Commissioners. Subtracting the number of Category II cases (51) from the number of total cases (151), leaves the Commission with 100 active cases assigned to the Teams.

For fiscal year 2023 that began on July 1, 2022, the Commission reviewed, deliberated on and closed out a total of 56 Category 1 cases, 6 officer-involved shooting cases, and audited 2 Category II cases. The 56 Category cases had a total of 281 allegations and 20 other findings. The Commission also evaluated 40 disciplines and 3 shooting review board reports. The Commission has no officer-involved shootings or in-custody death cases.

Team 1 has 6 active cases in their queue. All are Category I cases and 3 have one or more sustained findings. The Team also has 10 Category II cases which are on hold.

Team 2 is inactive.

Team 3 has 18 active cases in their queue. All 18 cases are Call by I cases. Four have sustained findings. The team also has 5 Category IV uses of hold. Team 4 has 28 active cases in their queue. All are Category usage. Of the 28 cases, seven have sustained findings. The Team also has 17 Curgory II cases which are on hold.

Team 5 has 24 active cases in their queue. A¹ 24 cases are category I cases. Seven of the Category I cases has one or more sustained findings. The Team also has 10 Category II cases which are on hold. Team 6 has 24 active cases in their queue all of valich are Category I cases. Five

of the 24 cases have one or more su tain. I fir angs. The Team also has 9 Category II cases which are on hold. Team 7 is inactive.

On Friday, the independent bulk a stallyst will release its review of the proposed budget. Budget Review Committee hearings for all city departments will take place from May 3rd-10 v 9th Sine Office of the Commission on Police Practices presentation accordeduled for May 9th from 2pm-5pm. Interim Executive Director Sharmaine Moseley plans to give her presentation in person within Council Chambers.

In FY2023, the Commission's budget was \$2,550,352 and the proposed budget for FY2024 is \$2,203,115. The proposed budget includes an additional \$110,831 for Personnel Expenditures and a reduction of \$458,068 (which was for onetime funding of outside counsel, rent for office space, and Executive Search firm services). The proposed budget for the Commission is reduced by \$347,237. This includes an increase for the General Counsel position so that the Commission has (1) FTE position budgeted in FY2024 instead of .50 FTE which was in the adopted budget for FY2023.
