## ITEM-3: \* KEARNY MESA COMMUNITY PLAN UPDATE

City Council District: 6,7 Plan Area: Kearny Mesa

The updated Kearny Mesa Community Plan is proposed to replace the 1992 Kearny Mesa Community Plan, with an accompanying rezoning to citywide zones. The draft under consideration provides a comprehensive policy framework for future growth and development over the next 20 to 30 years of the approximately 4,400-acre Kearny Mesa Planning Area. The Kearny Mesa Community Plan Update also proposes amendments to the General Plan and San Diego Municipal Code and to rescind the StoneCrest Specific Plan. Consistent with the General Plan and the Climate Action Plan, the draft community plan proposes a land use strategy with additional capacity for employment and residential in Transit Priority Areas (TPAs). The draft community plan also includes policies to provide a multimodal transportation system to promote active transportation, increase transit use, and provide more connections in the community. A Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR) was circulated for public review. A Final PEIR along with the responses to comments has been provided for review and consideration. Report No. <u>PC-20-038</u>.
