### SIGN PAINTER

#### **DEFINITION**:

Under general supervision, to perform skilled sign painting, design, and layout work; and to perform related work.

### \* EXAMPLES OF DUTIES:

- Designs, arranges, and draws sign patterns and layouts;
- Operates spray guns and uses brushes and rollers in painting street signs;
- Selects and mixes paints;
- Sands, cleans, and prepares surfaces for painting;
- Cuts film patterns from layouts;
- Stretches silk on silk screen frames;
- Processes photo sensitive silk screen stencils;
- Applies film to framed silk;
- Screens signs and decals;
- Masks signs;
- Operates scotch-lite machine in applying reflective material;
- Repairs damaged print screens;
- Hand letters and gold leafs signs, office door and window titles, banners, and City equipment;
- Leads the work of assigned personnel.

#### **MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:**

Please note: the minimum qualifications stated below are a guide for determining the education, training, experience, special skills, and/or license which may be required for employment in the class. These are re-evaluated each time the position is opened for recruitment. Please refer to the most recent Job Announcement for updated minimum qualifications.

Successful completion of a State-accredited two-year Sign Painter Apprenticeship Program; <u>OR</u> two years of experience as a journey-level Sign Painter; <u>OR</u> two years of experience and training which must include a minimum of one year of journey-level Sign Painter work. Satisfactory completion of one technical trade school or college course in screen printing and/or one course in hand lettering may be substituted for a maximum of one year of the required experience by allowing six months credit for each course.
