# EFFICACY METRICS

# STR ORDINANCE

# WHY METRICS ARE IMPORTANT

- Ordinance will come for yearly review
- Holding the city accountable to goals
- Holding the city accountable to negative impacts

# STOCK OF NATURALLY OCCURRING AFFORDABLE HOUSING (NOAH) AND OVERALL HOUSING COST

- Concern: STRs concentrated in certain neighborhoods will drive up housing costs.
- Purpose: Keep track of how many homes remain in the affordable category and track price increases.

# PUBLIC SCHOOL ENROLLMENT

- Concern: Concentration of STRs will diminish the desire of long term residents and families to live in those neighborhoods.
- Purpose: Will monitor the health of long term resident populations.



# TRACK RENTS OF COMMERCIAL AND RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES

- Concern: STRs will drive gentrification and long term business and residents out.
- Purpose: Make sure rent is not rising disproportionately in areas where STRs are concentrated.

## STR RELATED NUISANCE CALLS TO THE POLICE AND CODE ENFORCEMENT AND THE TIMES THOSE CALLS ARE MADE

- Concern: STR party houses and code enforcement being able to respond within an appropriate time frame
- Purpose: To track where party houses are occurring, if the Good Neighbor
   Policies are working and how effectively in enforcement responding



# TOT FROM STRS

- Concern: The revenue will not offset the cost to communities.
- Purpose: To track how much revenue the city is generating from this use and ensure the city allocates spending accordingly.

# TRASH PICKUP FREQUENCIES

Concern: The amount of trash these properties produce will be significantly higher than long term residential units.

Purpose: To compare the amount of trash created by STRs versus residential

properties.



# DEMOGRAPHICS OF OWNER/OPERATORS OF STRS

- Concern: STRs will be concentrated within areas and populations.
- Purpose: To determine if there is an equitable distribution of STR licenses.

# FULL OCEAN BEACH MOTION

Acknowledging the possible strain that is put on beach communities as well as other tourist heavy communities, we ask that the City Council add the following quality of life metrics to the STR ordinance: Stock of Naturally Occurring Affordable Housing (NOAH), cost of general housing, public school enrollments, increase on rents both commercial and residential, STR related nuisance calls to the police and code enforcement, TOT revenues from STRs, increase in trash pickups. These metrics should be done at a frequency where reasonable adjustments to the ordinance can be made.

# RE-WORKED MOTION

Acknowledging the possible strain that is put on communities, we ask that the City Council add the following quality of life metrics to the STR ordinance, to be used to evaluate the efficacy of the ordinance during it's required yearly review: Stock of Naturally Occurring Affordable Housing (NOAH), cost of general housing, public school enrollments, increase on rents both commercial and residential, STR related nuisance calls to the police and code enforcement including times these calls were placed, TOT revenues from STRs, increase in trash pickups, demographics of STR owners/operators.

# OTHER SUGGESTIONS THAT COULD POSSIBLY INCLUDED

- Water usage
- Impact to off street parking
- Increased strain and damage to infrastructure
- Older data on proposed metrics for comparison
