Proposed Wage Hike Hurts San Diego Small Businesses And District 7 Working Families

As a small business owner, I know firsthand the difficulties of running a business.

Starting a company from scratch is very tough. When I began my business we were on a nickel and dime budget for several years and barely made it through.

Luckily, I had a good team and we eventually became profitable. Even after we were established, running a business was never easy.

Our local government should do everything in its power to encourage the establishment and growth of small businesses, not make it harder.

Small businesses are the lifeblood of our local economy. Over 90 percent of businesses in San Diego are small businesses. In order to create more jobs, we need to encourage the expansion of existing business and the creation of new small business.

This is why I am very concerned about the proposed plan to increase the minimum wage within City limits.

An increase in the minimum wage in the City of San Diego alone will give surrounding cities like Poway, Chula Vista, and La Mesa a business advantage against already struggling small businesses in the city of San Diego.

Not only that, a minimum wage will create a new city bureaucracy, a local San Diego IRS to enforce the minimum wage increase. This new bureaucracy could cost taxpayers millions.

I support the minimum wage, but it should be implemented by the state and not by local municipalities alone.

The multi-year process to completely update the Mission Valley Community Plan for the first time since 1985 will begin later this year. As part of the Mission Valley Community Plan

the recently completed River Park Master Plan will be incorporated.

Mission Valley has been and is projected to be one of the fastest growing communities in the City of San Diego and the approved budget helps kick off this much needed update. Councilmember Sherman will keep Mission Valley residents informed regarding any public workshops and information sessions.
