Councilmember Sherman and San Diego Opera Introduce New Educational Arts Program

In November, I joined with San Diego Opera General Director David Bennett to announce a new youth educational program named "My Voice in the Arts" that will provide free full-season subscriptions to San Diego Opera performances to San Diego youth in each Council District.

Students will also be able to go backstage after performances to meet and learn from singers, performers, and backstage personnel.

This new program will expose students from all backgrounds who otherwise would not have the opportunity to experience the arts firsthand. The program will also help create and educate a new generation of opera enthusiasts. My Voice in the Arts was funded through the Council Offices of Sherman, Cate, Gloria and Zapf.

To apply, students must complete an application and submit a written 250-500 word essay responding to the question: "*One example of how art has affected me is*…"

needs world class arts and entertainment. This new youth program will help inspire new interest in the opera for the next generation of San Diegans.

Councilmember Scott Sherman, County Supervisor Dianne Jacob, and La Mesa Councilmember Kristine Alessio officially announced a new program called the 5-Peak Challenge at Mission Trails Regional Park.

The 5-Peak Challenge is a multi-part hiking challenge set across the five major summits at the 7,220-acre Mission Trails Regional Park. Hikers who participate will traverse 11.5 miles of hiking trails for a total elevation change of 6,000 feet.

The challenge is a wonderful activity for all ages which will also assist in reducing

traffic on Cowles Mountain by encouraging hikers to venture onto some of the less utilized trails within the Park.

Sherman, who also serves as Chairman of the Mission Trails Regional ParkTaskforce was excited to see the challenge begin and hopes that it will create more interest in the Regional Park and all it has to offer.

Councilmember Sherman declared November 10th to be "Doug Beckham Day" in the City of San Diego

Mr. Beckham has served on numerous community organizations since 1994, including the Linda Vista Recreation Council, the Linda Vista Town Council, the Linda Vista Planning Group, and the Linda Vista Neighborhood Watch.

Born and raised in Linda Vista, Doug played Little League and adult baseball at Tecolote Park, and contributed to the development of the Melinda Appling Memorial Pavilion, saving Skateworld, and the addition of the upcoming Linda Vista Skatepark.

In addition to serving his community, Doug served with honor in the Vietnam War as a Marine Engineer. Mr. Beckham was awarded two Purple Hearts and a Cross

of Gallantry from the Republic of Vietnam.

"It is particularly fitting that we honor Doug the day before Veteran's Day, when we honor all our service men and women for the sacrifices they have made for our freedoms," Councilmember Sherman said. "Doug has not only dedicated his life to his community, but also to his Country.

Councilmember Sherman Urges Residents to Prepare for El Nino

With a strong likelihood of El Nino driven storms causing flooding in San Diego, the State of California Department of Insurance is spreading the word about important information about insurance coverage for residents.

Flood damage is not covered by traditional homeowners insurance. Flood insurance is only available through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) and there is a risk 30 day waiting period before the policy is effective. San Diegans living in areas with any risk of flooding should consider flood insurance through the NFIP. Residents can receive information at the following link: www.floodsmart.gov/floodsmart/.

The California Department of Insurance helps provide consumers with information to understand home/residential insurance so that they can make the best decision for their situation, including informational guides, a premium comparison tool, and a new coverage comparison tool that allows consumers to compare the differences between insurance policies offered by insurers.
