# Item 202: Appeal of the Environmental Determination MPF (Marijuana Production Facility) 7955 Arjons Drive - Project No. 602575.

Total Estimated Cost of Proposed Action and Funding Source:

All costs associated with processing this project are paid through a deposit trust account by the applicant.

Council District(s) Affected: 6.

Proposed Actions:

Appeal of the Environmental Exemption determination pursuant to California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Section 15303(c), New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures, for the proposed Conditional Use Permit to operate a Marijuana Production Facility within an existing Suite "A," comprising of an operational area of 4,576 square feet within an existing 19,971 square-foot industrial building. The project site is located on a 0.91-acre site at 7955 Arjons Drive in the IL-2-1 Zone within the Mira Mesa Community Plan area. Project operations would include the cultivation, trimming, and distribution of cannabis products to State of California licensed outlets.

The project was determined to be categorically exempt from CEQA on November 14, 2018. The scope of the subject hearing only includes the environmental determination and not the Conditional Use Permit.

According to San Diego Municipal Code Section 112.0520(e) Power to Act on Appeal, the City Council shall consider the appeal and may:

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(1) By a majority vote, deny the appeal and approve the environmental determination that the project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Guidelines Section 15303 (New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures); or

(2) By a majority vote, grant the appeal and set aside the environmental determination in accordance with San Diego Municipal Code Section 112.0520(f);

Directing the City Attorney to prepare the appropriate resolution according to Section 40 of the City Charter;

If the City Council grants the appeal, the lower-decision maker's decision to approve the project shall be held in abeyance. The City Council shall retain jurisdiction to act on the revised environmental determination and associated project at a subsequent public hearing.
