- B. <u>Public Art Committee</u> Commissioner Vernon Franck, Chair of the Public Art Committee, reported that the installations of the public art projects for the Bayside Fire Station and Southcrest Trails Park are underway and expected to be complete this winter; the groundbreaking for the San Ysidro Branch Library, site of an upcoming public art commission, occurred earlier in the month; the public art proposal for the Chollas Water Operations Facility will be on display for public feedback through January 26 at the Oak Park Branch Library; and the public art project, here comes the neighborhood, was featured in the UT's year-end round-up of most compelling visual art projects of 2017.

Schwabe introduced himself and gave welcoming remarks.

Springs reported that Commissioners' 2017 Statements of Economic Interest are due at the beginning of April. She announced that Poetry Out Loud regional finals, sponsored in part by the Commission's grant from the California Arts Council and produced by City contractor, Write Out Loud, will be held at the Central Library on February 6, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. Springs reported that the City's Park & Recreation Department and Library Department are jointly seeking Statements of Qualifications from programing service providers and encouraged the Commission's contractors to apply. She reported that the Independent Budget Analyst's summary of the City's Council's budget priority memos is expected to be announced later this afternoon. She reported that the three incoming Commissioners' appointments are expected to be docketed for City Council ratification in February. She expressed appreciation for outgoing Commissioners Larry Baza, Laurie Mitchell, and Kathi Diamant.

Dear Mayor Faulconer:

San Diego's arts and culture ecosystem is accretive to both the quality of life and economic prosperity of our city. The proposed cut of 2% from the "Base Budget", which is actually a *cut of at least 31% from the current funding levels*, would destabilize that ecosystem, endanger the economic contribution that the arts and culture assets provide to the city, and diminish our quality of life.

The arts and culture ecosystem is an engine for San Diego's continued economic growth. As a recent economic impact study by Americans for the Arts revealed, the arts in San Diego is a **\$1.1 billion industry**, responsible for:

- more than 36,000 jobs,
- over half a billion in direct spending by arts organizations,
- driving tourism,
- educational outcomes (from pre-K through college), and
- workforce development specifically in attracting and retaining talent to the San Diego region.

The City's annual investment represents an **incredible return on Investment**, both in terms of economic activity and in social impact. Each of the 133 local nonprofits and individual artists whose programs the City helps fund, must **match the investment made by the City at 3:1** through private philanthropic funds. A Commission contract is not a "handout", rather it is an investment that successfully fills a gap, spurs on philanthropy, and *allows organizations to extend access to arts and culture and enhance our city in a way that — like parks, libraries and other neighborhood services* — *enhance our quality of life*.

San Diego's arts and culture assets make us a better San Diego. As you so accurately pointed out in your State of the City address, **"we are strongest when we are united**", and it is through the shared vocabulary of arts and culture that we forge the **"One San Diego"** of which you spoke so eloquently. Arts and cultural organizations of every size and discipline are represented in every community and neighborhood; even those that may have "historically overlooked" by others are served by the arts ecosystem.

The arts know no boundaries and helps stitch all our neighborhoods together into One San Diego. From the public art installations in the new **San Ysidro library**, to the San Diego Symphony's **ComicCon** performances, from the work of the AjA Project with Sudanese refugees in **District 9**, to the works that The Old Globe and the La Jolla Playhouse send to **Broadway**, San Diego's arts and culture ecosystem **brings quality to the lives of everyday San Diegans in each neighborhood and community**.

For the reasons stated above (and so many that, for the sake of brevity, remain unstated), we cannot, as members of the Commission or as individual citizens, support any option that would inherently undercut our mission and the well-being of San Diego's arts and culture ecosystem or the citizens our cultural assets serve so faithfully.

While last year's cuts were restored later in the budget process with one-time funds, the originally proposed, deeply cut, budget set the new baseline for FY19. It is from that new, starkly reduced, "**Base Budget**" that Commission staff has been tasked with proposing an additional 2% cut. If this proceeds un-amended, it will put the FY19 budget at just **two-thirds of prior years' budgets** and is **actually a cut of 31%** from FY18. This is a *disproportionate cut* to quality programming that affects citizens in every neighborhood of our city.

On December 15th, at our final Commission meeting of 2017, we were shown three budget reduction scenarios and asked to provide a recommendation for which scenario to advance as a proposal. Rather than support any of the draconian options presented (each of which represented a **cut of at least 31%** from the current year's budget), we **unanimously voted to reject all of them.** Instead we expressed our continued **support** for meeting the City Council's established goal of "Penny for the Arts" funding by restoring the 9.52% of TOT funding as an on-going source, instead of one-time funds.

We understand and appreciate that our city faces a projected budget deficit, but this requested cut from the "base budget" is a disproportionate reduction. **These programs are not "optional"; they are indispensable**. These programs are in vital in every corner of the city, including those communities that others may "overlook".

It is our honor to serve as members of the Commission for Arts and Culture. It is our mission to promote and support San Diego's artistic and cultural assets, and ensure that the arts and culture ecosystem has the needed resources to thrive and to continue its significant contributions to both our city's economy and quality of life. We ask that you consider maintaining funding for the Commission for Arts and Culture in the FY2019 budget at the level it was in the FY2018 adopted budget.

It is truly an investment that pays dividends in every aspect of our economy and to our quality of life.
