ITEM-151: An Ordinance amending Chapter 2, Article 6, Division 4 of the San Diego Municipal Code by amending Sections 26.0404 and 26.0406, relating to the Appointment and Qualification of Members of the Ethics Commission. (Citywide.)

# **ITEM DESCRIPTION:**

1) Add to the Municipal Code that "priority consideration shall be given to nominees with some demonstrated familiarity and experience with campaign finance laws, government ethics, lobbying laws, and conflict of interest regulations."

2) Increase, from two to three, the required number of attorneys.

3) Increase, from one to two, the required number of Commissioners that "have been a candidate for elective governmental office, have worked as a treasurer or in another high-level position in a campaign for elective governmental office, or have held elective government office."

4) Clarify that a Commission's restriction against seeking public office applies to elective office in the City of San Diego.
