A. No Association with Known Gang Members: Standing, sitting, walking,
driving, bicycling, gathering or appearing anywhere in public or in public view with one or more

3 No Guns, Weapons or Replicas of Guns/Weapons: (1) Possessing, Β. 4 discharging or using any dangerous weapons in any public place or place open to public view; (2) 5 knowingly remaining in the presence of anyone who is in possession of or using a dangerous 6 weapon including but not limited to: knives, clubs, concealed weapon, unloaded or loaded 7 firearms or ammunition, baseball bats, glass bottles, bb guns, metal pipes or any other instrument 8 prohibited by Penal Code Section 12020; (3) knowingly remaining in the presence of such gun, ammunition or dangerous weapon; or (4) possessing any replica fire arm or knife, bb gun or 9 10 knowingly remaining in the presence of anyone who is in possession of such an item;

C. No Fighting: Challenging to fight or engaging in a fight in the public
streets, alleys, and/or public and private property;

D. No Graffiti/Vandalism or Tools: (1) Possessing marker pens, spray paint cans, nails, razor blades, screwdrivers, or other sharp objects capable of defacing private or public property; or (2) using marker pens, spray paint cans, nails, razor blades, screwdrivers, or other sharp objects capable of defacing private or public property to deface, apply graffiti to or otherwise vandalize any public or private property;

18 E. No Trespassing: Being present on any property not open to the general
19 public, except with (1) the prior written consent of the owner, owner's agent, or the person in
20 lawful possession of the property; or (2) in the presence of and with the voluntary consent of the
21 owner, the owner's agent, or the person in lawful possession of the property;

F. No Blocking Free Passage: Blocking the free passage of any person or
vehicle on any street, walkway, sidewalk, driveway, alleyway, or other area of public passage;

G. Stay Away From Drugs: (1) Participating in any way in the selling,
possessing, or using, without a valid prescription, of any controlled substances, or illegal drugs,
including but not limited to: phencyclidine (PCP), heroin, cocaine, cocaine base or rock cocaine,
ecstasy and marijuana; (2) possession of related drug paraphernalia, including but not limited to,
rolling papers, pipes or any other devices used for injecting, smoking or ingesting illegal drugs;

(3) knowingly remaining in the presence of anyone selling, possessing, or using any controlled
substance or illegal drug; or (4) being under the influence of a controlled substance or illegal
drug;

H. Stay Away From Alcohol In Public: Anywhere in public or a place open
to public view: (1) drinking or possessing any open container of an alcoholic beverage; (2)
knowingly remaining in the presence of anyone possessing an open container of an alcoholic
beverage in public; (3) knowingly remaining in the presence of an open container of an alcoholic
beverage in public; or (4) being drunk in public;

9 I. No Burglary Tools: Possessing channel lock pliers, picks, wire cutters,
10 dent pullers, sling shots, steel shots, shaved keys, porcelain casing, spark plugs, rocks, "slim
11 jims," and other devices capable of being used to break into locked vehicles without a legitimate

13J.No Acting as a Lookout/Providing Refuge: Acting as a lookout by14signaling to, whistling, yelling, or using other means to do so, or soliciting, encouraging or15employing another to do so; or hiding someone who is evading a law enforcement officer;

20 by using the index finger and the thumb;

L. No Gang Clothing: Wearing clothing which bears the name, symbol or
letters of the gang known as "Westcoast Crip," "Westcoast," "Coast," "WCC," "WC," "W," "C,"
or subsets such as "30," "3," "0," "YBB," or YLC," or wearing blue shoe laces, bandanas, belt
buckles, rubber bands in hair, or baseball caps;

M. No Intimidation: In any manner confronting, intimidating, annoying,
 harassing, challenging, provoking, assaulting and/or battering, or threatening the peace or safety
 of any residents or patrons or visitors to *Target Area I and Target Area II*, including but not
 limited to the use of vulgar or abusive language, whether (1) in retribution for any past complaint

or to prevent a future complaint about Defendants' gang and nuisance activities, including 1 2 complaints to law enforcement officers, or (2) any other purpose;

No Littering: Littering in any public place or place open to public view; N. О. No Loud and Disturbing Noise: Making, causing, or encouraging others to make loud noise of any kind including, but not limited to, yelling and playing loud music at any time of the day or night, or participating in boisterous parties;

7 Ρ. No Public Congregating: Congregating in any public place or in any place open to public view with any other person for the purpose of engaging in any conduct prohibited 8 9 by this injunction or any criminal statute;

9 enrolled as a full- time or part-time student in an educational institution or job training program
10 within ninety days of the date of service of this judgment.

V. Jurisdiction is retained for the purpose of enabling any of the parties to this Final
Judgment to apply to this Court at any time for such order or directions that may be necessary or
appropriate for the construction, operation or modification of the Final Judgment, or for the
enforcement or compliance therewith.
