Pacific Beach DUI Checkpoint Nets 8 DUI Arrests

On August 10, 2016 the San Diego Police Department conducted a DUI checkpoint in the 2600 block of Ingraham Street in Pacific Beach. The checkpoint was made possible by a California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) "STEP Grant."

The checkpoint was operational from 12:12 am until 3:00 am. 247 vehicles passed through the checkpoint, with 247 of those motorists being screened by officers. 18 motorists were detained for a further evaluation of their sobriety, and 7 arrests were made for DUI in or near the checkpoint. 7 vehicle impounds were also conducted.

"The message is simple, *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over*. Drinking alcohol and driving do not mix. If you plan to consume alcohol, you should also plan not to get behind the wheel of a vehicle or ride a motorcycle," said Officer Mark McCullough.

The San Diego Police Department recommends these simple tips:

- Plan a safe way to get home <u>before</u> you attend the party. Alcohol impairs judgment, as well as reaction time. If you're drunk you're more likely to choose to drive drunk.
- Designate a sober driver, take public transportation, a car service, or a call a sober friend or family member to get home.
- Walking while impaired can be just as dangerous as drunk driving. Designate a sober friend to walk you home.
- Report Drunk Drivers Call 911.
- If you see someone you think is about to drive while impaired, take their keys and help them get home safely.

The national *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over* crackdown is led by the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) and NHTSA, with the California Avoid DUI Task Force Campaign, combining high-visibility enforcement and heightened public awareness through publicity.
