### **POLICE INVESTIGATE HOMICIDE IN O'FARRELL COMMUNITY**

On Tuesday, August 2, 2016, at approximately 5:40 p.m., the San Diego Police Department received a 911 call of a shooting in the area of 61<sup>st</sup> Street and Alderley Street in O'Farrell.

When officers arrived, they found evidence that a shooting had occurred at that location. Shortly after, the San Diego Police began receiving reports of two shooting victims who were driven to Paradise Valley Hospital in National City in two separate vehicles. One of the victims was an 18-year-old male with bullet wounds to his upper body. The second victim was a 25-year-old male with a non-life threatening gunshot wound to one of his legs. Both victims were transported to a San Diego Hospital where the 18-year old victim later died from his injuries. Homicide detectives were called to the scene to investigate the incident.

Preliminary investigation revealed the victims were standing in a small group near the intersection of Alderley and Kirtright Streets when they were approached by two African American males on foot. One was wearing a black hoodie and the other one was wearing a red hoodie. The suspects both began firing handguns into the group and they fled on foot eastbound on 6100 Alderley Street. Both suspects were described as thin and between the ages of 19-21. At least two vehicles near the scene were struck with gunfire. Detectives are in the area of 6100 Alderley Street searching for and collecting evidence.

The homicide victim has been identified as 18-year-old, Gregory Davis, who lived nearby. The surviving victim is 25-year-old, Avery Ealy of San Diego.
