



Unknown Suspect Wanted for Check Fraud and ID Theft Series

Up to a \$1,000 Reward Offered

San Diego County Crime Stoppers and investigators from the San Diego Police Department's Economic Crimes Unit are asking for assistance from the public to help identify and locate an unknown female suspect wanted for a series of identity theft, check fraud, and commercial burglary cases.

On various dates between August 9, 2016 and September 7, 2016 an unknown female suspect entered various Bank of America locations throughout San Diego County and cashed stolen and counterfeit checks. The suspect is presenting different counterfeit identification cards with her photograph, but uses the victim's names and information in order to cash the checks.

The suspect has cashed fraudulent checks totaling over \$ 15,000.

Suspect's Description: *The suspect is described as a White female, approximately 40 to 45- years-old, thin build, with brown hair. She was seen in surveillance video driving away in a gold colored sedan possible a Saturn vehicle.*
