## Annual Used Oil and Oil Filter Recycling Event to be Held in Balboa Park

## CITY KICKS OFF FALL/WINTER SCHEDULE OF FREE USED AUTO PRODUCT RECYCLING EVENTS

SAN DIEGO – City of San Diego residents are encouraged to bring their used or leftover oil and oil filters, as well as fluorescent light bulbs and household batteries for recycling at the Environmental Services Department's <u>Used Auto Product Recycling Event</u>. The event will be held at Balboa Park on the corner of Presidents Way and Park Boulevard on Saturday, Oct. 8 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

## A few important details:

- Used motor oil, oil filters, contaminated oil and antifreeze are accepted;
- The City also accepts fluorescent light bulbs, car batteries and household batteries;
- The service is FREE to City of San Diego residents only;
- No commercial or business waste will be accepted;
- Maximum transportation limit: 10 gallons or 125 pounds.

"Last year, more than 630 residents participated and we collected 750 gallons of used oil and antifreeze, as well as over a ton of used batteries at the Balboa Park event," said the Environmental Services Department's Hazardous Materials Program Manager Joy Newman. "We're inviting all City homeowners and renters to participate this year to help make San Diego a safer, greener community for all."
