SAN DIEGO ARTS LEADER RECEIVES NATIONAL AWARD FOR COMMUNITY ARTS LEADERSHIP



San Diego, CA— June 19, 2009 - At the annual Americans for the Arts national convention in Seattle, the **2009 Selina Roberts Ottum Award** for Arts Leadership was presented to **Victoria L. Hamilton**, executive director of the City of San Diego Commission for Arts and Culture. Each year, the organization honors those who are committed to building communities through the arts. Presented since 1991 by Americans for the Arts and the National Endowment for the Arts, this award recognizes the achievements of an individual who has made a meaningful contribution to the arts through arts leadership in the local arts agency field. This is only the second time the award has gone to a Californian.
