Update on Homicide in Bay Terraces

San Diego – On September 21, 2021, just after 8:00 p.m., the San Diego Police Communications Center received multiple 911 calls regarding a shooting at 300 S. Meadowbrook Drive in a Bay Terraces apartment complex.

When officers from Southeastern Division arrived on scene, they found a male down in the parking lot with at least one apparent gunshot wound to his upper body. The officers began performing CPR until San Diego Fire-Rescue personnel arrived on scene. A large, aggressive crowd gathered and additional police resources were called to disperse the crowd so medics could attend to the injured male and to protect the crime scene. The male was transported to a local hospital, but unfortunately, he was pronounced deceased at 8:41 p.m. A second injured male came forward and was also transported to a local hospital from treatment of non-life-threatening injuries.

San Diego Police Homicide Detectives were called to the scene and began investigating the incident. Detectives learned a group of young males were playing basketball in the courtyard of the apartment complex when neighbors reported hearing gunfire. The group scattered and the mortally injured male was assisted away from the immediate scene to the parking lot where officers located him.

There is no suspect description at this time. Detectives are attempting to locate evidence and any possible witnesses. Investigators are aware several people were present at the time of the incident, but scattered immediately after. Detectives would like to speak to them.

The mortally injured male has been identified as Cleo Woods, 16, of Spring Valley.

The second male has been identified, however his name is also not being released at this time. He is described as a 14-year-old Black male. He sustained non-life-threatening injuries and is expected to recover.
