CS-1 California Capital Insurance Company v. City of San Diego

CS-3 Sturtevant Farms and State Compensation Insurance Fund v. Workers' Compensation Appeals Board, et al.

California Supreme Court Case No. S258513

For workers' compensation benefits, California law limits an injured worker's recovery to 100% permanent disability for each of seven different body regions. The State Compensation Insurance Fund is appealing a decision from the Workers' Compensation Appeals Board regarding the proper interpretation of this provision. The State Compensation Insurance Fund has asked the City of San Diego to write an amicus curiae letter requesting the California Supreme Court to grant review in this case. The City Attorney brings this request to the City Council for direction.

CS-4 Otay Water District v City of San Diego
