Here are my thoughts:

I urge keeping District 1 together as is; it allows for stronger representation from our council person and other city representatives. It provides continuity with our schools, libraries and recreation facilities and holds onto a secure tax base by not moving businesses into another District.

Who does this benefit by splitting University City, who is really driving the bus?

Do not divide University City, keep it whole, don't break up the family.

I also am addressing the UCSD students who are blaming La Jolla and University City for their housing issues, that is misdirected. The onus is on the University; they accepted more students than available housing. Why doesn't UCSD do more outreach in all communities to assist with housing? Are the students given some type of discount if they don't live on campus?
