

San Diego, Calif., April 11, 1910.

To the Common Council,
of the City of San Diego.

Gentlemen:-

I desire to report that the Police Department found a prostitute in Till A. Burns' saloon, at the northwest corner of 5th and I streets, No. 500 Fifth street, on Saturday afternoon, April 9, 1910.

The liquor ordinances of the City expressly prohibit saloons from harboring, admitting, receiving, or permitting to remain in any saloon any lewd and disollute female, or common prostitute.

I had previously notified Mr. Burns that he was to keep all such people out of his saloon and to comply strictly with the liquor ordinances.

I recommend that the Common Council serve notice upon Mr. Burns to appear before the Common Council and show cause why his liquor license should not be revoked.
