



Suspect Wanted in Felony Hit and Run

Up to a \$1,000 Reward Offered

December 9, 2015

San Diego County Crime Stoppers and investigators from the San Diego Police Department's Traffic Division are asking for assistance from the public to help identify and locate a suspect wanted in a felony hit and run.

On November 29, 2015, at approximately 1:20 p.m., a two-year-old boy was with his parents at Mesa Viking Park in the Mira Mesa Neighborhood of San Diego. The child rode away from his parents on a toy scooter and into the street. The child rode eastbound across the 11200 block of Westonhill Drive. The child was struck by a late 90's Honda Accord that was traveling northbound on Westonhill Drive. The vehicle fled the scene after colliding with the child and continued to drive northbound on Westonhill Drive. The child suffered major non-life threatening injuries.

The suspect vehicle is described as a late 90's teal green colored Honda Accord. The vehicle may have a dent near the driver's side headlight assembly. The driver was described as an unknown race female in her 60's.
