- I. <u>Call to Order</u> Commissioner Julie Z. Cramer called the City of San Diego (City) Commission for Arts and Culture's Public Art Committee (PAC) to order at 10:17 a.m. at the office of the Commission for Arts and Culture (Commission), Civic Center Plaza, 1200 Third Avenue, Floor 9, Suite 924, San Diego, California 92101.

C. <u>Other Reports</u> – Commissioner Franck reported that at the May 25, 2018 Commission meeting, the Commission recommended that the Acting Executive Director of the Commission for Arts and Culture accept the final artwork proposal by Roman de Salvo for Mission Trails Field Station in fulfillment of the City's collecting mission, collection scope and accession criteria.

IV. <u>Presentations</u>

- A. <u>Preliminary Artwork Idea for Children's Park by Miki Iwasaki</u> Chief of Civic Art Strategies Christine E. Jones, provided an overview of the Children's Park Public Art Project and introduced artist Miki Iwasaki. Iwasaki then presented his preliminary artwork idea. PAC members provided feedback and asked questions about the artwork idea. Discussion topics included the strength of the artwork's aesthetic, durability of the material to be used, and its function in the park and relationship to the site. Jones noted that following the receipt of this input, Iwasaki will begin to develop his preliminary artwork idea into a schematic artwork proposal.
- B. <u>Schematic Artwork Proposal for Fire Station 50 by Susan Zoccola</u> Chief of Civic Art Strategies Christine E. Jones, provided an overview of the Fire Station 50 Public Art Project and introduced artist Susan Zoccola. Zoccola then presented her schematic artwork proposal. PAC members provided feedback and asked questions. Discussion topics included the strength of the artwork's aesthetic, durability of the material to be used, lighting design for the artwork, color scheme for the artwork and the building, and relationship of the artwork to the site.
- C. <u>Presentation and Discussion Outcomes for Council Policy 900–11, Inclusion of Public Art</u> <u>in Selected Capital Improvements Program Projects Amendments</u> – Postponed in the interest of time.
- V. <u>Reports</u>
 - A. <u>Staff Reports</u> Chief of Civic Art Strategies Christine E. Jones provided an update on the recent appointment of Jonathon Glus as the Commission's new Executive Director. She also reported on the launch of the online portal to access the City's Civic Art Collection. The online portal will include images, descriptions and locations of the City's art collection. Additionally, she gave an overview of public engagement for here comes the neighborhood: San Ysidro and shared the past work of project artists Janelle Iglesias, Fallen Fruit and Wendell Kling.
