Last night, the Council approved a City budget that reflects my commitment to rebuilding San Diego. I am proud to have secured more than \$20 million in infrastructure investment in my first six months in office, including an increase to the road-replacement bonds Council approved in March and budget revisions that augmented ongoing maintenance funding and provided for vital condition assessments of City buildings, park and recreation facilities, and sidewalks. The Council was also able to add four hours at every branch library and fund critical public safety needs.

Ultimately, we delivered a budget that is balanced, on time, and has bipartisan support. To learn more, stop by my second **Signature Event** on June 26 in Rancho Penasquitos. The topic will be San Diego's fiscal health and future. (See below for more event details.)

Last week I joined with leaders from across San Diego County to urge the Governor not to kill the state's Enterprise Zone program, one of the few incentives we have in our business expansion, attraction, and retention arsenal. As a result of Enterprise Zones, over \$1.7 billion worth of capital investment has been made within the San Diego Enterprise Zone region, more than 40,000 jobs were created between 2006 to 2012, and thousands of businesses have received technical, financial and permit expediting assistance, and no-cost job referral services, as well as tax savings for qualifying Enterprise Zone businesses.
