First, I wanted to share with you a <u>Q&A that was recently published in U-T San Diego</u> that discusses my work in pushing for a long-term infrastructure plan for the City. As you know, the City has pushed maintenance and improvements for San Diego's roads, sidewalks, storm drains and more to the back burner. I have a plan to get us back on track.

Preventing illegal dump sites

I also wanted to update you on some new dumping incidents in recent weeks. You may remember that a couple months back, we cleaned up two illegal dump sites near Rancho Bernardo Community Park. Since then, many of you have been on the lookout for similar situations and I am happy to report that two other incidents were identified and cleaned up as soon as we heard about them.

In order to prevent this from happening again, we are installing barriers at the entrance to the staging area where there has been repeated incidents.
