
# All About the City's Only Dairy Farm

Did you know the City of San Diego's only dairy farm is located in District Five? I recently had the chance to tour the **Frank Konyn Dairy** in San Pasqual Valley. The owner, Frank Konyn is a second generation dairy farmer, whose father started the business in 1962. Each day, the dairy produces over 6,500 gallons of fresh milk produced by more than 850 Holstein dairy cows.

At one time, there were more than 200 dairies in the San Diego region. Over the years however, due to the rising cost of doing business in California and the high price of land, many dairy farmers have taken their operations out-of-state or closed.

Despite that, Konyn is beginning to diversify his operation in order to produce local organic milk because of the demand from local restaurants for more organic products. A local organic milk supply from Frank Konyn Dairy means more farm-to-table experiences for San Diegans. I think that is something we can all support!
