The land purchase is complete but need funds to complete improvements including pool and rec center. The OMPG Parks Sub-Committee has met twice and supports the amendment. Comments from the Board: K. Murphy interested in the cost details for the improvements. R. Mahoney commented that the community needs parks but that the City's estimates are too high because of extravagant design standards. Residential owners are already having problems in getting projects to pencil out. Rob Hixson agreed that the design standards are too far above the average for parks. Mel Ingalls commented that the City should move to cut the costs of park construction down.</li> </ul>	A motion was made and seconded to support the amendment. The motion passed with one abstention by M. Freed.
		C. Street Auto Dismantling – Currently operating under a CUP and seeking approval for continued use. The site is under the Brown Field flight path and has a mitigated Neg. Dec. Approval conditioned on street improvements with first phase improvements along Otay Mesa Road with future improvements for Heritage Innovative, and Datsun.	A motion was made and seconded to support. The motion passed with three abstentions by T. Ricotta, T. Story, and J. Street.
		D. Otay Mesa Road median fence – The City would like to keep the median fence in place to prevent pedestrian crossings.	A motion was made and seconded to support a letter to be sent to the City requesting that the median fence be removed. The motion passed with one abstention by R. Hixson.
