 - **a.** It was noted that community has been having trouble understanding alignment and where crossing goes up and goes down.
 - **b.** John Haggerty introduced Frank Sweeney and David Hicks.
 - c. Slides shown of project map.

- d. Identified that trolley expansion starts at Old Town, traveling north in railroad corridor with various stops. At Gillman and La Jolla Colony will go under street. Crosses over freeway to La Jolla Village Square site with station and parking. Will stay aerial crossing I5. Working on bridge to go over Gillman Dr. and I5. At Regents and Genesee will be aerial again. Westfield is last stop.
- e. Expect to start heavy construction at the end of the year that will take 56 months to complete.
- f. Have already started utility construction.
- g. Noted that they have had a lot of workshops in the community for input.
- **h.** Most of the work will be done during the day with some night work at UTC.
- i. Staging at Nobel in La Jolla Village Shopping Center.
- **j.** Road widening of various degrees up to 7 feet on each side of Genesee will need to be done to accommodate columns where trolley will be suspended 30 feet in the air and they are in the process of buying right of way rights.
- **k.** Bike lanes will be included to City standards.
- I. Will have Gillman Dr. Bridge in place and then demolish Voight bridge and rebuild.
- m. Noise wall was discussed.
- **n.** Transnet is poised to go ahead, design nearly complete.

10. Action Item: Action Item: Spectrum 3 & 4, PTS 422478

Presenter: Chris Clement, Director, Construction & Development, Alexandria Real Estate Equities, Inc.

- a. Developer for life sciences committed to neighborhoods and life science in SD.
- **b.** Reviewed location on slides.
- c. Existing building 156,000 sq. ft. combined of the two buildings.
- **d.** Floor space is insufficient for current needs.
- e. Buildings are islands with no underground parking.
- **f.** Pointed out retention basins, etc. that need to be modernized.
- g. Energy inefficient.
- h. Replace buildings A and B.
- i. Development density reviewed.
- **j.** Parking increase of 158 spaces.
- **k.** Increasing planting areas with drought tolerant and native species.
- I. Improve pedestrian amenities and parking with campus feel.
- m. Encourage alternative transportation forms with bike facility and walkways.
- **n.** Direct connection to patio with outdoor site amenities rather than current walking distance to picnic table.
- **o.** Building rendering identified lots of glass and light.
- **p.** Shared learning lab will be available to students within the community.
- **q.** Noted view from amenity area of glass and solar canopies that track with the sun.
- **r.** Underground is one continuous parking area.
- s. Bike 101 program available to encourage employees to learn how to ride to work.
- t. Transportation initiatives will be monitored.
- **u.** Storm water design highlighted as educational feature in how it runs alongside path and into the basin.
- v. Landscape design will increase green space with drought tolerant plants and maintain Torrey Pines.
- **w.** Vertex representative spoke about Vertex accomplishments, 100-150 employee expected growth, use of electric bikes, active intern program and educational options.
- **x.** Current and anticipated number of trips were discussed and noted that traffic study has been approved.
- y. Q: If something of concern is noted in final report do you agree to come back? A: Yes.
- z. Noted adding 50,000 sq. ft. in development and not asking for any more trips.
- **aa.** It was noted that some areas are not included in trip area sq. ft. (e.g., stairwells, etc.) **bb.** Reviewed list of transportation incentives for reducing trips.
- **bb.** Reviewed list of transportation incentives for reducing trip

- **cc.** Q: If Vertex leaves town, how do we know that implementation measures are being implemented? A: Permit conditions carryover to new tenants.
- **dd.** Q: As the TDM program is required as part of the permit, is the target based on traffic count? A: Yes.
- ee. Permit is conditioned to meet target with mitigation measure.
- ff. Q: Are policy and parameters the same as others in the past year? A: Yes.
- gg. There are 203 additional trips after take out of areas such as stairwells.
- **hh.** Community Plan identifies ability to use approved TDM.
- ii. Person from Biocom spoke in support of Vercom and hopes planning group will support it.

Motion: Move to approve project with mitigating conditions that are in the permit. TDM monitoring will be for five years and if property is sold, TDM monitoring will start again for another five years. None of the plants to be invasive and will minimize potential for bird strikes.

Vote: 14 in favor, 2 recusals, and 1 opposed, motion passed.

11. Action Item: The Scripps Research Institute Expansion PTS 424480

Presenter: Jon Ohlson, Architect

- **a.** Amending to accommodate expansion.
- **b.** Relayed existing site of neuro parking lot.
- c. 204 feet entitled that was never realized.
- d. Proposing to develop to 192,000 sq. ft.
- e. Showed map of parking lots and proposed location.
- **f.** Going to extend the plaza, eliminating traffic on site by using tunnel to get to parking structure.
- g. Showed enhanced parking structure with green screens.
- **h.** Rendering shown of view from Genesee avenue as gateway going into the mesa.
- i. Drawing showing properties used by Scripps Institute.
- j. Various views shown of entrance to parking that is out of site versus surface parking.
- **k.** Q: Is building less than entitled to? A: Yes, fully entitled.
- I. Q: How high is parking structure? A: 20 40 ft. (40 ft. is maximum allowed)
- m. Project is Leed Silver.
- **n.** View from road including plants and trees (Torrey Pines) was described.

Motion: Move to recommend approval by PK and seconded by NM and RR.

Vote: Unanimous approval, motion passed.

12. Information Item: Westfield Residential SCR

Presenter: John Alderson, Vice President/Development Westfield

- a. Review of next phase of development at UTC.
- **b.** Planned residential building discussed.
 - i. Location to be on 1.4 acres at the corner of Nobel and Genesee where Goodyear Tire sits today.
 - ii. 22 story building with 300 units that will face east and west.
 - iii. Parking will be under the structure.
 - iv. Over parked so does not spill out to street or stores.
 - v. Will be rental apartments and not condominiums.
 - vi. Inspiration for amenities is retain resort environment.
 - vii. Discussion on green open space for these units and the trail from mall to Town Center Dr.
 - viii. Code requirements will be reviewed.
 - ix. Construction will probably start beginning of next year.
 - x. 10% of units have to be affordable housing.
- c. Landscape discussion.
 - i. Jacaranda trees with no invasive species.
 - ii. Mesa remains with park with pedestrian access to get up hill to residential building.
 - iii. Landscape slides shown.
- d. Westfield will maintain the ownership of the park and looking at ways to make it better.

- **e.** Noted that with and without the bridge or widening of Genesee was reviewed and met all traffic requirements.
- **f.** Will get package in June and City takes 30 days to make comments.
- **g.** Majority of units would be studios and one bedrooms with a minimum number of 3 bedroom units.
