 1. Truck Traffic—making some progress. We recently Port with EHC and Councilman Alvarez to get law enforcement involved. Signage regarding truck traffic—pretty extensive. Some signs need to be replaced as some are faded. Port is contracting with

- Traffic Engineers to do counts will be completed by the end of April to determine how many violators. They know there is a problem and they are going to work on it.
2. Shelter Island Boat Launch was built in 1950's. Port has about \$10m from state to fix it. Work starts in late April/early May through 2018. Boat Launch will be closed for repairs through the entire process.
 3. Red Bull Air Races—April 14, 15, & 16. Friday is practice run. You can see it from Cesar Chavez Park, behind Sea Port Village and by Midway. Race way is from Sea Port Village to Midway. Planes take off from Brown field. Event from 9 or 10 am
 4. Cesar Chavez Park Parking—Impacted Monday through Friday due to working people. Port has a three-hour time limit enforcement. Jan-March 14 they issued 432 tickets. 364 were for parking before parking limit. Each ticket cost \$52. The Port has been working on solutions. Cesar Chavez parking lot will allow parking between 7-10pm for \$5.00. WOW---BLPG is very excited about this information. Ron will bring more information at the next meeting. BLPG is waiting to see it writing.

Eve Sieminski—Iron Fist Brewing, owner
