- c) Soccer City Initiative proponent Craig Benedetto
 - i) Goal San Diego City. Overview of initiative. Major League Soccer is growing. Providing 30 acre site. Built and maintained by the investors. Goal to create a world class entertainment district. Also built office space and residential housing. Second largest trolley location on site. Goalsd.com (website and initiative can be found here). Meets the city's goals. Traffic impact report completed and traffic will be mitigated. Also mitigates SDSU's football program. Will design a flexing stadium 12,000 to 33,000 based on sporting event. Will also provide student and affordable housing. Investors to pay for demo and site remediation.
 - ii) Jon Labaw commented about the parking spaces for the trolley stop. (16,000). 12 cities are applying, how many cities will have stadium certainty. Bari Vaz commented about the surrounding community parks if they will be accommodated. Yes. March of 2020 is when the team would start playing. Ted includes a potential for an NFL stadium, 16 acres. Wayne Cox commented about being a headlong rush to build. If you rush, is that best solution for the citizens of San Diego?
- d) Soccer City Initiative for Qualcomm Stadium Property Joe LaCava (Action)
 - i) Taking advantage of loophole in state law. Way for private investors to get a hold of public owned land. No EIR. Bypassed public review. No enforceable mitigations. Mission Valley planning not part of review. Not about soccer. Is a real estate transaction. Not sure what exactly is being proposed. Traffic study has not been reviewed and it is the opinion that it is also not fully vetted. Investors do not have an agreement with San Diego State. SDSU should be part of the conversation.
 - ii) Fenton does not like the process. Jon Labaw asked if opposed to a project or process. It is about the opportunity and best value for San Diego. Not a density issue. Ted Brengel requested a copy of the presentation.
 - iii) Craig Jackson When will the park be constructed? It will be completed afterward the construction of the stadium. Just need a majority vote. No motion.

- i) Request, then withdrawal for stop sign. City requirements stated it did not meet the requirements for the stop sign.

Bruce Brown makes Motion to add 2 stop signs on Montongo north and south. Marv Miles seconded. Approved 12-2-1. Jon and Chris Morrow oppose. Albert Lee abstain.
