# 2. Troy Murphree - CACC Board Member

i.

a. Murphree suggested installing a map of community boundaries in the local College-Rolando library for all the community to see. The cost would be about \$300 for a detailed SANDAG map.

The suggestion may be put on a future agenda for a vote.

V. Governmental and University Liaison Reports (3 minutes per speaker)

1. Roberto Torres - Director of Communications for Councilmember Georgette Gómez - District 9

a. Spoke about the homeless crisis and Hepatitis A outbreak. Streets and rest rooms are regularly being sanitized. Mayor has opened a temporary shelter on 28th and B street to house about 200 homeless individuals and also trying to identify other properties to shelter the homeless. Continue to contact the office of Councilmember Gomez for any homeless issues.

b. City Council Meeting on Mon. Oct. 23 @ 1pm in the Council Chambers in downtown to discuss what short term solutions for the ordinance. Several options on what to do about owner occupied vacation rentals.

c. Question: Is there a hand out on the options. Response: Please email me for that information

d. College library parking lot - church will be demolished soon and opening conversations to get a permit to open the parking lot temporarily and then a longer term solution should the zoning change goes through.

e. City plans to allocate funds to Tubman Park - December or January

f. Concerning the companion unit ordinance, conversations are ongoing for working with City Attorney to address the concerns of the College Area Community. Other avenues are being looked at; for example, owner must live on premise

i. Questions: San Diego Housing Commission Report - Councilmember any position on that report.

1. Response: At this moment we do not have a comment on it.

ii. Question: Do campus dorms count towards that or are they separate?

1. Response: Do not know - will look into it.

2. Officer John Steffen -SDPD San Diego Community Relations Officer - Eastern Division

John Steffen is the main contact for parties and citations. a.

b. Losing 14 officers a month - many are going to other agencies for better pay and benefit packages

> i. 1805 staffing - current

Should be at 2100 officers - 300 short ii.

c. Eastern Division are being sent everywhere to fill in for demand in other districts.

d. Many more complaints coming in dealing with homelessness and mental illness are taking up a great deal of resources.

There are numerous crimes in the College Area - over 60 non-students were stopped e. and 40 of them are connected to gang activity.

Many robberies - most including cell phones

f. Response times are up - except for emergency calls

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Party calls are not emergency calls and calls for parties are not getting the response time deserved.

g. Question: What can we do as a community to get the resources needed?

> Response: Requests for more resources should to go directly to elected officials.

X. Delegate Reports

1. \*Community Planners Committee - Rhea Kuhlman

a. Kuhlman provided updates on the additional affordable housing regulations and the companion unit ordinance. CPC reviewed and voted on proposed revisions to the city code in connection with the 11th Land Development Code update. There was nothing that would seriously impact the College Area community.

b. Interim Park Equivalency regulations - City is working on a park master plan. In the interim, Councilmember Scott Sherman (District 7) suggested that instead of adding open space, find other equivalencies and call them parks

- i. Widening sidewalks
- ii. Adding lighting
- iii. Median strips
- iv. Counting regional parks such as Mission Trail Park and Balboa Park as community parks
  - 1. Every community was opposed to this proposal because it was the mayor and developers who decided what a park equivalency would be. CPC would support most

regulations if the communities got to decide what is an acceptable park equivalent.

2. College Area Public Safety (CARPUS) - Terry Shirley

a. Not much more to add than what the police lieutenant spoke about, especially in terms of the homeless situation. The two common threads that come at the Carpus meeting are homelessness and loud parties.

b. The crime in the area goes up when school is in session because the predators come out during the school year to prey on the students. Stay Alert!
