This drive is made throughout the United States on Armistice Day by the Disabled American Veterans of the World War.

The reason for making this request at this time is to enable the Chapter to make arrangements with the National Headquarters at Cincinnati, Ohio. This drive is not in any sense a "tag-day" drive, but is for the purpose of selling forget-me-nots and the money derived by this is to be used for relief to veterans and in making arrangements for the State Convention to be held in San Diego June 1925.
