GENTLEMEN:

I am forwarding herewith, pursuant to the terms of Ordinance No. 581 (N.S.), the application for license to conduct a public dance on premises where intoxicating liquor is sold, of James Howard Kennedy. The premises for which the license is sought are located at 4693 University Avenue, San Diego, California.

Section 9 of Ordinance No. 581 (N.S.) calls for a recommendation with respect to such application. I am therefore recommending that this application be denied. Under date of August 29, 1942, I transmitted to your Honorable Body a similar application from Robert B. and Jennie Maples for this location. I made a similar recommendation at that time, namely, that the license applied for be denied. This recommendation, like the one made two years ago with respect to these premises, is predicated upon our judgment that the location is not suitable for the conduct of such business.

A petition, together with certain newspaper publicity, attached to the application accompanies this letter, as I assume that is the desire of the applicant.
