Online Forum Aims to Engage Public on Future of Mission Valley

NEW PLATFORM OFFERS INNOVATIVE WAY TO PROVIDE FEEDBACK ABOUT MISSION VALLEY COMMUNITY PLAN

SAN DIEGO – The public has a new way to share opinions about the future of Mission Valley. The City of San Diego has just launched an online portal dedicated to collecting feedback that will help shape the Mission Valley Community Plan, which will guide development and priorities for public investment over the next 20 years.

Anyone who visits the portal can take a short survey and participate in an interactive mapping exercise—all designed to get a better picture of the community's vision for Mission Valley. The portal will be open for comments through June 30, 2016.

"We want the public to be part of this process," said Nancy Graham, Mission Valley Community Plan Update Project Manager with the City's Planning Department. "This is an effective and convenient way for residents and stakeholders to help shape the future of Mission Valley, all from the privacy and convenience of their own home."

These two online activities are the first in a series that will be launched on the portal. Future exercises will focus on parks and recreation, infrastructure, urban design and more.
