City of San Diego's 2017 Used Oil Recycling Events Kick-Off Jan. 28

FIRST EVENT OF THE YEAR TO BE HELD AT QUALCOMM STADIUM

San Diego – The City of San Diego's Environmental Services Department, Household Hazardous Waste Program is hosting the first of five recycling events aimed at taking used oil, oil filters, batteries, antifreeze, and CFL bulbs/tubes off the streets, out of storm drains, and keeping these hazardous materials out of the Miramar Landfill on Saturday, Jan. 28 at Qualcomm Stadium from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

"Here's an opportunity to start 2017 by helping to keep our environment clean," said Hazardous Materials Program Manager Joy Newman. "These events are geared to do-it-yourselfers and home mechanics only. No commercial or business waste is accepted. A few local retailers like AutoZone, Firestone, and O'Reilly also accept used oil and oil filters."

WHAT:	Used Oil and Oil Filter Recycling Event
WHO:	City of San Diego, Environmental Services Department CalRecycle
WHEN:	Saturday, Jan. 28, 2017, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

- WHERE: Qualcomm Stadium 9449 Friars Road (Near Section J) San Diego, CA 92108
- VISUALS: Residents driving up to drop-off hazardous materials; Workers removing hazardous materials from vehicles and placing them into secured, large containers; and Visuals of hazardous liquids being poured and recycled.

A few important details:

- Used motor oil, oil filters, contaminated oil and antifreeze are accepted;
- The City also accepts fluorescent light bulbs, car batteries and household batteries;
- The service is FREE to City of San Diego residents only;
- No commercial or business waste will be accepted;
- Maximum transportation limit: 10 gallons or 125 pounds.
