Learn What Makes Buildings Safe at Free May 17 Event

BUILDING SAFETY MONTH EVENT FEATURES EXHIBITS, DISPLAYS AND DEMONSTRATIONS

SAN DIEGO – Do you know how many fire and carbon monoxide alarms should be in your home? Do you know how structures are built to protect your family during earthquakes? The City of San Diego's Development Services Department (DSD) is focusing the public's attention during the month of May on the effects of building safety, resilience, accessibility and sustainability in the built environment for our residents, both in everyday life and in times of natural disaster. DSD staff invites the public to learn more about building safety on May 17 in the City's Civic Center Plaza Concourse, 202 C Street.

WHEN: Wednesday, May 17, 2017 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

DSD staff will be on hand throughout the day on May 17 to do interviews and answer media questions about various building safety topics, including fire safety, guardrails, earthquake preparedness, swimming pool barriers, wildfires, landslides, accessibility and water heater safety.
