Largest Graduating Class in History of San Diego's Career Online High School

18 GRADUATES TO BE HONORED IN CEREMONY AT CENTRAL LIBRARY

SAN DIEGO – As graduation ceremonies are held in schools and universities nationwide, 18 adult learners will be recognized for completing their high school education through Career Online High School, a program offered by the City of San Diego and San Diego Public Library. On Wednesday, May 24 at 5:30 p.m. these students will be presented with certificates of achievement at the San Diego Central Library.

As part of the Career Online High School program, scholarships are awarded to qualified learners who want to earn a diploma and prepare for a career in one of eight high-demand industries. With 18 graduates, this year's graduating class is the largest in San Diego since Mayor Kevin L. Faulconer launched Career Online High School in 2015.
