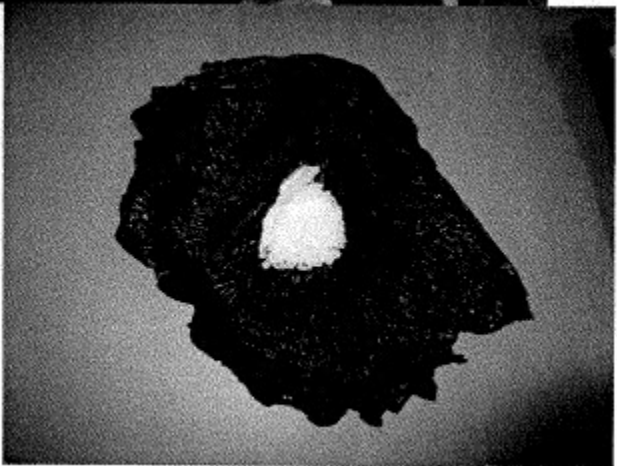

**Community Complaints Lead Southeastern Division  
Officers to Recover Multiple Weapons and Make  
Several Arrests for Narcotics**

**San Diego**– On February 15, 2018, at 9:45 a.m., San Diego Police Officers from the Southeastern Patrol Division and Quality of Life Team were conducting an investigation based on numerous community complaints about narcotic activity and homelessness issues in front of a residence located in the 7600 block of Prairie Mound Way. Officers conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle leaving the residence. During the course of the investigation, officers arrested three adult males for transportation and sales of a controlled substance and recovered approximately 2 lbs. of methamphetamine, a .22 caliber rifle, a replica AR-15 rifle (pellet gun), and a replica semi-auto handgun (pellet gun). An additional adult male was arrested for an outstanding felony auto theft warrant.
