#### **Committee Discussion on Housing**

On Wednesday, April 18, Councilmember Gómez held a committee discussion on strategies to preserve the City's current affordable housing stock and on how to prevent residential displacement. Stephen Russel, with the San Diego Housing Federation, and Kwofi Reed, with the Local Initiatives Support Corp., spoke about the strategies and challenges to preserving affordable housing in San Diego.



Our very own Keryna Johnson presented some solutions for preventing displacement of San Diego residents. The proposals included: protecting Section 8 tenants under existing tenant protection laws, exploring a Section 8 anti-discrimination ordinance, and protecting tenants from being displaced by renovated



housing units.

Councilmember Gómez and the Committee heard a lot of great ideas and she is committed to having further discussions on actions that can be taken to prevent residents from being displaced while building more housing for all San Diegans. Please join us May 21, as we continue to discuss this important topic.
