San Diego Fire-Rescue Bomb Squad Demonstrates the Dangers of Fireworks

ALL PERSONAL USE FIREWORKS ILLEGAL THROUGHOUT SAN DIEGO

San Diego – The City of San Diego Fire-Rescue Department’s (SDFD) Bomb Squad will detonate fireworks in a controlled environment to show how powerful and dangerous these seemingly non-threatening explosives can be. Fireworks are illegal in the city and county of San Diego except for permitted special events displays. Each year around the Independence Day holiday, people are injured, sometimes very seriously, because of fireworks. In addition to the threat of injury, they are a fire hazard.

“The Fourth of July holiday is for celebrations and fun,” said SDFD Chief Colin Stowell. “Our goal is to educate members of our community to the dangers of fireworks. This demonstration shows how powerful even small fireworks can be.”

Along with fireworks, barbecues and fire pits are a frequent cause of serious injuries. Representatives from the Burn Institute will be available to share safety information for those who will barbecue or take part in bonfires at beaches.
