City of San Diego Seeks Public Input on Development of East Village Quarter (Tailgate Park)

PUBLIC INVITED TO SHARE OPINIONS ON DESIGN CONCEPTS DURING THE VIRTUAL OPEN HOUSE

SAN DIEGO – San Diegans can play an important role in transforming the East Village Quarter site, currently known as Tailgate Park, into a vibrant space for everyone to enjoy. To capture public input, a <u>virtual open</u> <u>house</u> is open now through 5 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 4, 2020.

The interactive virtual open house will feature development design concepts for the public to review. Participants will be able to:

- Review the welcome presentation.
- View each design concept.
- Provide feedback via the online questionnaire.

"The Tailgate lot and surrounding area in East Village is a prime redevelopment opportunity that could become a hub of activity in the near future," said Mayor Kevin L. Faulconer. "We want to hear directly from San Diegans about what they think about the proposals under consideration as we work together to shape our City's future."

Participants can share their input on features they'd like to see, including housing, parks and walkable space, transit and mobility, retail and entertainment and parking for the 5.25-acre land redevelopment project. The open house results will be used to assist in informing the City what the community deems critical as officials negotiate the final details for the development.

The proposed development site is located in the four-block area between K Street and Imperial Avenue and 12th Avenue and 14th Street in Downtown San Diego.

San Diego residents and business owners are eligible to participate.
