Last week:

- Tuesday, Councilmembers Campbell, Montgomery, and Moreno joined me in <u>calling for transparency and</u> <u>cooperation</u> with the public and City employees ahead of difficult budget process.
- On Wednesday, I invited local experts to join me for a Spanish Language Telephone Town Hall to hear about the most current information and get questions answered about COVID-19. Visit my website to listen.
- Local leaders and I sent a letter to Governor Gavin Newsom on Thursday, urging him to take action to address the needs of California's undocumented community during the COVID-19 pandemic.
