- <u>Priority:</u> Help disseminate accurate information, streamline resources, and identify consistent talking points to support an equitable response to vaccine distribution

# City General Plan Environmental Justice Element | Vickie White, City of San Diego Planning Dept.

- <u>Previous General Plan:</u> Environmental justice was an element spread throughout the plan
- <u>Updated General Plan:</u> Prompted by Senate Bill 1000 and new state guidelines, there will be an entire section dedicated to environmental justice
- <u>Purpose:</u> To address unique or compounded health risks in disadvantaged communities
- <u>Project Timeline:</u> Expected completion in mid- to late 2022
